<p>Unit Theme: Stories vs Informational Text: On the Farm</p>	<p>November 5-9, 2018</p> 					
<p>Language Arts/Reading <u>Phonemic Awareness</u> – Students will continue to blend sounds together to make new words. We will also continue to segment sounds in words. <u>Phonics</u> – Students will blend words with all letters to read CVC words. Students will read all sight words, including look and up. New letter sounds: w, j, y. Sight words he and she. We will assess blending words with previously learned sounds and letter sounds b, l, r, u. <u>Literature</u> – Students will explore answering the question: What makes a good story? Students will determine the differences between informational text and stories. We will use stories and books that focus on farm animals to explore these topics. We will continue to focus on setting and character exploration. <u>Writing</u> – Students will practice writing to tell about a character, including text evidence in their writing.</p>	<p>Things to work on at home with your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write name (capital and lowercase) -Count to 20 by ones - Read with your child every night - Practice tying shoes -Practice fastening and unfastening belts -Practice writing numbers 0-10 in increasing and decreasing order -Use the words RIGHT and LEFT as often as possible in daily communication. A green dot at the starting point for writing will be helpful for beginning writers! -Practice all sight words nightly 					
<p>Math Students will explore measurement using non-standard units. Focus will be on weight.</p>	<p>Nov. 6, 2018</p> 					
<p>Social Studies/Science Students will focus on animal life cycles in science – focusing specifically on the frog’s life. Students will learn about American symbols in social studies.</p>
