


Kindergarten News

<p>Unit Theme:</p> <p>Applying our Knowledge of our 5 Senses to our World</p>	<p>September 10-14, 2018</p> <p><u>THE 5 SENSES</u></p> 
<p>Language Arts/Reading</p> <p><u>Phonemic Awareness</u> – Students will continue to blend sounds together to make new words.</p> <p><u>Phonics</u> – Students will ID letters in their names. We will continue to focus on left and right tracking.</p> <p><u>Literature</u> – Students will explore answering the question: How do our senses help us learn? Students will look at pictures and use text clues to explore an informational text. We will continue to answer prompts using text evidence to support answers.</p> <p><u>Writing</u> – Students will practice using response journals to answer sentence prompts. We will create a class book about our 5 senses, using text evidence in our writing.</p>	<p>Things to work on at home with your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write name (capital and lowercase) -Count to 20 by ones - Read with your child every night - Practice tying shoes -Practice fastening and unfastening belts -Practice writing numbers 0-8 -Use the words RIGHT and LEFT as often as possible in daily communication. A green dot at the starting point for writing will be helpful for beginning writers!
<p>Math</p> <p>Students will count groups to tell how many and will learn to form the 6-8.
